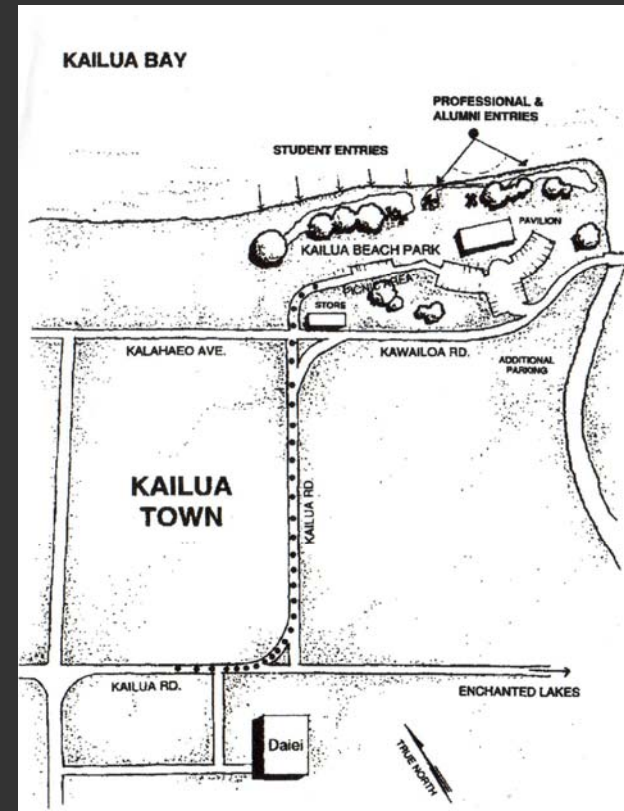

A jury will evaluate entries on the basis of originality, beauty, interpretation of the theme, use of medium and craftsmanship. Banners and team spirit will also be judged.

Teams will have two hours to construct. Sculptures should be preplanned to maximize building time. Only natural beach sand found at site, debris found at site, water and sunlight is the medium. A limited amount of decorative, non structural elements other than the sand may be utilized. Bare hands, hand tools and simple 'forms' can be used for construction.

Playful designs are fine, although any humor should be visual, rather than verbal and corny puns or inappropriate signs are strongly discouraged.

JUDGING CRITERIA

A jury (3-4 faculty/staff members) will evaluate entries on the basis of originality, beauty, interpretation of the theme, use of medium and craftsmanship. Banners and team spirit will also be judged.

Playful designs are fine, although any humor should be visual, rather than verbal and corny puns or inappropriate signs are strongly discouraged.

Exercise of good judgment by keeping designs tasteful and suitable for public and family audiences. This will be considered in the jurors' evaluation.

All entries –both professional and student- will be graded (A-F; +/- system allowed). Grades will be written conspicuously in the sand with a pointed instrument.

RULES & REGULATIONS

Participants:

All Architecture students at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa School of Architecture. There should be ONLY 3-6 members per team. Teams made of members from different studio levels is allowed. Teams with more than 6 members will be disqualified.

Employees of an entering architectural firm and their immediate families. There should be ONLY 3-6 members per team. Participating firms are allowed to have multiple of teams. Teams with more than 6 members will be disqualified.

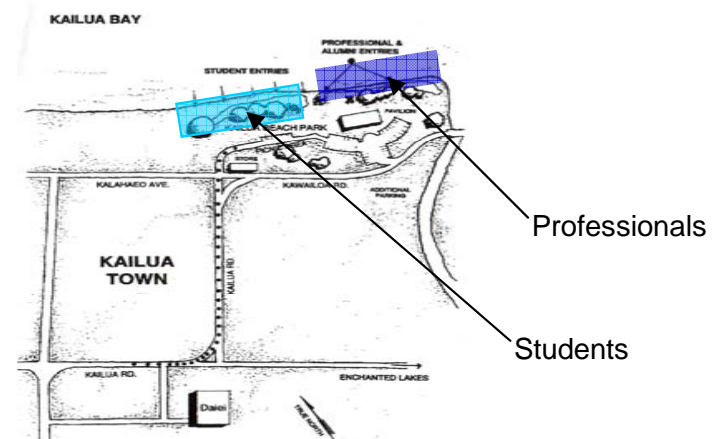
Banners: All teams are required to furnish a 'banner' to designate their team name, studio level, firm name and/or title of their sculpture. Banners should look like the sculpture. Banners should be supported above grade to facilitate ready identification of teams. For safety reasons, please insure that any stakes used to support the banner are clearly marked.

Time Limit: 2 hours commencing promptly at 9am. At 8:50am all participants should assemble at the designated sand sculpting area for final instructions and announcements.

Medium: Only natural beach sand found at site, debris found at site, water and sunlight is the medium. A limited amount of decorative, non structural elements other than the sand may be utilized.

Tools: bare hands, hand tools (shovels, trowels, spatulas, etc.) and 'forms' such as buckets. Specially built casting or molding forms may be used as long as they are reasonable in size and complexity.

Site location: only in designated area (see map).



Site Preparation: designated areas for each team may be cleared from debris before 9am starting time. Banners should also be erected before the start of the contest. No other preliminary work will be done before 9am.

Restoration of Beach: upon completion of the event, each team is responsible for leveling its own area before leaving the park or must make appropriate arrangements for its removal. Please try to leave your sculptures up until at least 2pm so that the public may enjoy them.
